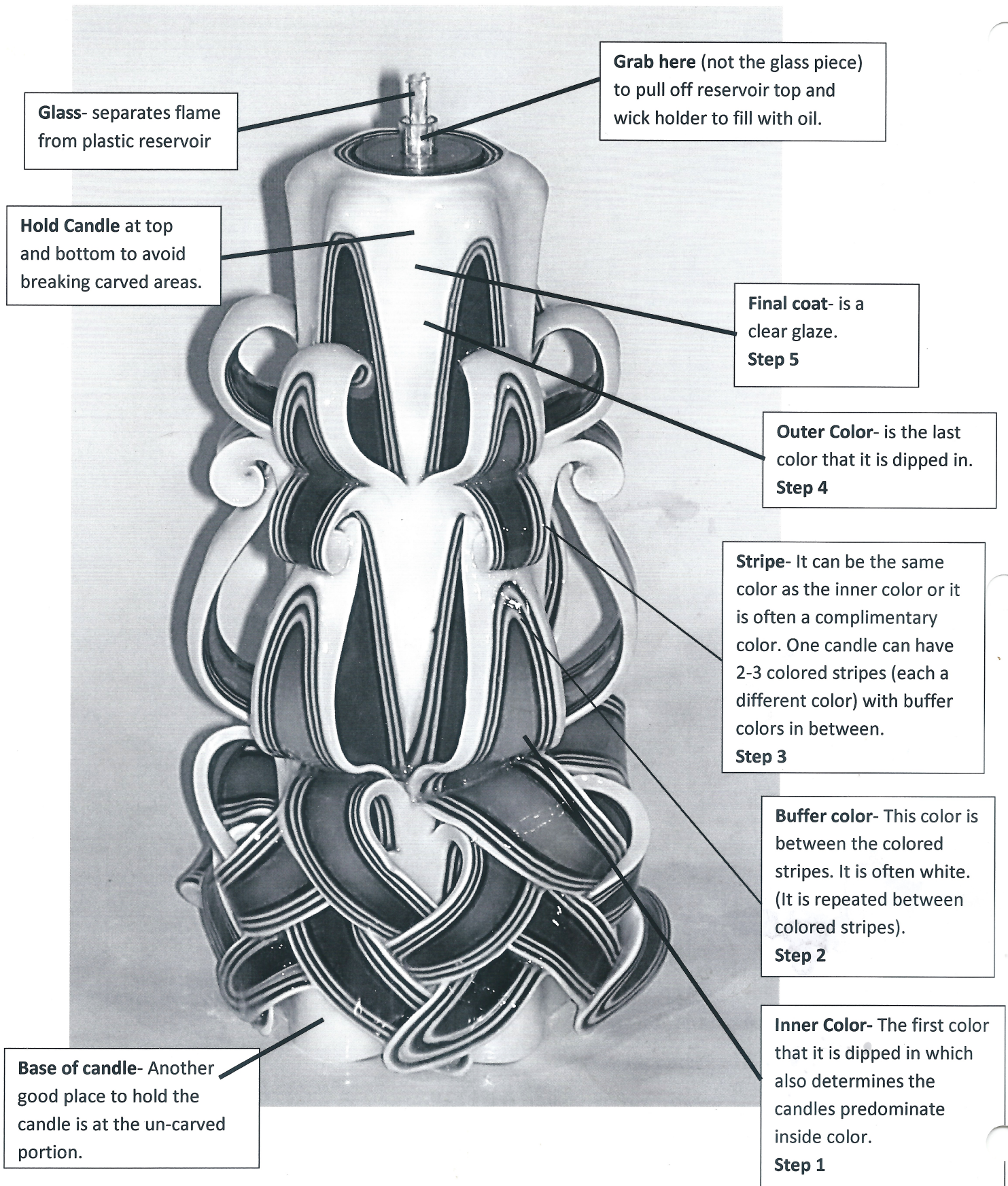


Anatomy of a *Lifetime Candle*



Glass- separates flame from plastic reservoir

Grab here (not the glass piece) to pull off reservoir top and wick holder to fill with oil.

Hold Candle at top and bottom to avoid breaking carved areas.

Final coat- is a clear glaze.
Step 5

Outer Color- is the last color that it is dipped in.
Step 4

Stripe- It can be the same color as the inner color or it is often a complimentary color. One candle can have 2-3 colored stripes (each a different color) with buffer colors in between.
Step 3

Buffer color- This color is between the colored stripes. It is often white. (It is repeated between colored stripes).
Step 2

Base of candle- Another good place to hold the candle is at the un-carved portion.

Inner Color- The first color that it is dipped in which also determines the candles predominate inside color.
